

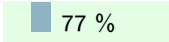
1 Evaluation Report

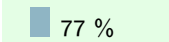
In the following report, you will gain a short overview of the results from the evaluation of course **'' Tensions of multilevel governance: The European Commission in focus ''** given by Prof. Dr. Christian Rauh. For the survey, the **customized SET.UP questionnaire** was used. The lecturer was able to adjust the questionnaire regarding his/her learning methods and aims in advance. The short evaluation report only contains some of the aspects, which have been defined by the Zentrum für Qualitätsentwicklung in Lehre und Studium. 16 students have participated at the survey. That means the evaluation of the results is based on **16 student opinions**.
